□ Section 179 Deduction: Take advantage of first year deductions on business property, up to a specific limit.
☐ Qualified Business Income Deduction: A deduction of up to 20% of qualified business income or certain small businesses.
☐ Work Opportunity Tax Credit: A federal tax credit available to employers who hire individuals rom specific groups with significant barriers to employment.
□ R&D Tax Credits: Available for companies that incur research and development (R&D) expenses.
Small Business Health Care Tax Credit: For small businesses that provide healthcare to their employees.
